## Squash Around The World



### Why Is there So Much Attention on this Sport?

- Squash is a U.S. Olympic Committee Schedule C sport and is contested in the Pan Am Games, Commonwealth Games, Asian Games, African Games, University Games and World Games.
- Squash is considered **the number one fitness activity** based on strength, agility, cardiovascular fitness, and convenience. Professional squash players are amongst the most fit athletes in the world.
- Ranked by Forbes Magazine as the #1 healthiest sport for fitness, agility and safety
- 1,400,000 squash players in the USA
- Fastest growing racquet sport in the USA
- Differentiator for college admissions



## Squash In The United States



### Squash is the Faster Growing Sport in the US?

- United States has the fastest growing squash participation worldwide Source: Sports & Fitness Industries Association (SFIA).
- SFIA shows 115% growth overall between 2008 and 2013 to more than 1.4 million squash players.
- Geographic growth is strong. In the years 2010-2013, West Coast tournaments experienced a 375% increase in the number of tournaments with a 55% increase in number of players per tournament.
- For past 10 years, US Squash membership has grown on average over **11% per year**.

## Squash Among American Youth



### Squash is One of the Hottest Junior Sports...

#### **United States (2010 to 2014):**

- US Squash Junior accredited tournaments grew from 110 to 156, 42% growth
- The number of accredited matches played grew from 14,270 to 20,305, concurrently
   42% growth
- Overall junior participation grew from 9,048 to 11,920, 31% growth

#### Midwest (2010 to 2014):

- Number of junior participants grew from 799 to 1130, 41% growth
- Adult amateur participation now includes 25 US Squash sanctioned tournaments in the Midwest

#### For Middle & High School Programs:

- High School Team Squash Championships has grown from 16 teams in 2004 to 152 teams in 2014, 850% growth
- The Middle School Team Squash Championships has grown from 29 teams in 2009 to 59 teams in 2014, 103% growth

# Squash At Colleges & Universities In The United States



### College-Bound High School Squash Players Are Increasing Significantly

- Since 2007, the number of teams in the U.S. High School Team Championships **increased** 88%; it is the largest squash tournament in the world with 1,500 players
- There are nine accredited Scholastic Squash Program Middle and High School Leagues around the country with **more than 300 teams** actively participating
- The 2012 High School Team Championships hosted 155 teams from 20 states. In 1998, only 43 schools had squash programs.
- Top ranked high school juniors in 2013 went to **Harvard**, **Yale & Princeton**, as well as other top colleges and universities around the country.
- More than 200 colleges and universities have squash courts, **including 23 of the top 25 colleges** as ranked by Forbes magazine.
- Every Ivy League University has a Varsity squash team.
- Since 2009, there has been an **18% increase in club and varsity college programs**, and this level of participation will increase as high school junior participation continues to drive collegiate club and varsity program development.

# Squash At Colleges & Universities In The United States



### Current College Squash programs around the country

- 65 Colleges and Universities have squash programs (Varsity or Club) in the United States (59 Men's, 43 Women's)
- 51% of these programs have their own squash courts
- Of the top 25 ranked teams in the country for Men's and Women's programs, 24 and 23 of those schools own their own courts respectively
- 8 is the average number of courts at a top
   25 ranked Men's or Women's school
- 18 Schools have 8 or more courts at their facility


# Squash At Colleges & Universities In The United States



- Of the 46 competitive schools where court counts are available, 89% have 5 or more courts.
- 5 or more courts has significance in squash it is the absolute minimum number of courts
  needed for a team to practice together building anything less denies the school an
  opportunity for a Club Team.
- Club squash team must have at least 10 players (9 starters and one alternate) with two players per court, requiring at least 5 courts to run a practice.

There are currently hundreds of international students competing in intercollegiate squash competition; this number is dwarfed by the amount of casual squash players who use the availability of recreational courts as one of the factors in choosing a college or university.
